
New York Times bestselling series.



# **Topeka Competition showcases innovative 3D art**

You'll be amazed by the more than 40 pieces of artwork representing a wide range of techniques and media in the *Topeka Competition* exhibit March 14 - May 11. The only common thread among the pieces is that all the artists work in three dimensions – art



ranges from sculpture to ceramics to jewelry-making. The exhibit is partially funded by the Friends of the Library.

The *Topeka Competition* is one of the best ways the Alice C. Sabatini Gallery connects with new innovative artists. In this year's exhibition 32 artists from 11 states are represented, making it one of the largest national showings in the competition's history.

This year's *Topeka Competition* is juried by Mona Cliff (A'aninin/Nakota Nations). Cliff, a multidisciplinary visual artist, explores the subject of contemporary Indigenous identity and culture through her use of traditional Native crafting methods such as seed bead embroidery and fabric applique.

Cliff selected the pieces for the exhibit based on originality, technical excellence and artistic concept. She will also determine Juror's Awards. Purchase Awards will be named by the Alice C. Sabatini Gallery and will become part of the library's permanent art collection. All awards will be announced at the Artists and Awards reception March 15, 3-4pm.
