



The Name of the Wind – Patrick Rothfuss


Mistborn – Brandon Sanderson


The Way of Kings – Brandon Sanderson


Between Two Fires – Christopher Buehlman


The Dark Tower – Stephen King

Roland, the world's last gunslinger, tracks an enigmatic man in black toward a forbidding dark tower, fighting forces both mortal and other-worldly on his quest.




The Lies of Locke Lamora – Scott Lynch

The Tawny Man Trilogy – Robin Hobb



Sabriel, daughter of the necromancer Abhorsen, must journey into the mysterious and magical Old Kingdom to rescue her father from the Land of the Dead.




Beautiful Creatures – Kami Garcia & Margaret Stohl

The Raven Boys – Maggie Stiefvater



Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children – Ransom Riggs


After a family tragedy, Jacob feels compelled to explore an abandoned orphanage on an island off the coast of Wales, discovering disturbing facts about the children who were kept there.


Swan Song – Robert McCammon


Oryx and Crake Trilogy – Margaret Atwood


Handmaid's Tale – Margaret Atwood

In a future world where the birth rate has declined, fertile women are rounded up, indoctrinated as "handmaids," and forced to bear children to prominent men.




World War Z – Max Brooks


Gone – Michael Grant


The Missing – Margaret Peterson Haddix


Ender's Game – Orson Scott Card


Maze Runner – James Dashner

In a future where most people have computer implants in their heads to control their environment, a boy meets an unusual girl who is in serious trouble.




Lorien Legacies – Pittacus Lore


The Knife of Never Letting Go – Patrick Ness
